## **HITLER SIGNS THE NON-AGGRESSION PACT WITH THE USSR: WILL THERE FINALLY BE PEACE BETWEEN THE GERMAN AND SOVIET PEOPLE?**

OUR FÜHRER,  
ADOLF HITLER,  
finally agreed on  
signing the NON-  
AGGRESSION PACT  
between our nation and  
the USSR, yesterday  
morning.

Yesterday,  
August 24<sup>th</sup>, Hitler and  
Stalin signed the Nazi –  
Soviet pact, in which  
both countries agreed  
not to attack each other,  
and, if there was a  
dispute or a problem

between the parties, it  
was promised to be  
handled in an amiable  
and fair way. The  
leaders would also  
remain neutral if either  
of them was attacked by  
a third party. Our

Führer has repeatedly said that the USSR, led by Joseph Stalin, feared an invasion by our army any minute. The majority of Germans, believe that the French and British nations are not prepared and would not accept or approve to get involved in a war with our nation, fearing to lose their power and, as many Germans state, "They are not fierce enough".

Our Führer has many times said in his long but worth-listening to speeches that he would not repeat the same mistakes as the German leaders who ruled before him. He assured peace in the western Europe, with Britain and France, by signing several pacts, which helped to improve the German international relations. Now, our very praised leader, took another important step: making

an alliance with our "arch" enemy, the USSR, to reach lasting peace. German people, when asked, are very excited and proud, of the decision taken by our wise Führer. Hitler was assuring his people that they would not have to fight a war in western fronts like France and Britain, and eastern fronts like USSR, by signing this peace treaty, although our government is not in agreement with the Communist ideas that rule the people of the USSR.

It is also very important to consider the fact that Stalin was never able to reach any kind of lasting agreement with Britain and France during the last years. He joined the League of Nations, something that, from any perspective, was not of much help to the Soviet Government.

Meanwhile, Hitler received the support from the British and French leaders, who slightly preferred our government rather than Communist one in the USSR. Our Führer moved to the Rhineland, making the USSR quite impotent and unsure that the French would stick to the treaty signed between them, which promised to protect the USSR against Germany. Chamberlain, the British foreign minister, was reluctant to commit Britain in a pact with the USSR and France, seeming more in agreement with Hitler's ideas and proposal for other treaties. Early this year, our minister Ribbentrop visited Stalin, and yesterday, both German and Russian leaders announced the terms of the Nazi-Soviet pact to the all nations in the world, promising to not

attack each other.  
Germans accepted the  
Pact enthusiastically,

hoping that, finally,  
peace will be achieved  
between the USSR and

Germany, which seem  
to solve their  
differences at last.
