Hitler shows his intelligence and willingness to rearm Germany.

The German leader Adolf Hitler sent troops to the Rhineland yesterday to recover Germans' confidence.

As we all know, in 1919 one of our November criminals, Friederich Ebert signed the peace treaty in Versailles with the Allies after WW1. That peace treaty brought us a lot of economic and political problems. One of the worse problems was the demilitarization of our frontier with France, known Rhineland. as the The demilitarization established that no German troops were allowed to be in that area. This fact got even

He wanted to risk himself by moving troops into the frontier and see if he was successful against the League (France most of all). He knew he was taking a huge gamble and he knew the risks.

But our heroic leader had a plan, as always. He chose the right time and place to make this dangerous move. The League of Nations was paying special attention to the Abyssinian crisis which was happening at exactly the same time as Hitler was acting. So the League condemned Hitler's action but had no power to do anything else.

On the other hand, our army was nothing compared to the level and number of troops it had during WW1. It lacked essential equipment and air support and was no match for the French army. That's why our forces had orders to pull out if the French acted against us. Finally, the last troops that were in movement arrived at the Rhineland yesterday and Hitler gave a speech to let us all know that we succeeded.
